



## First graduate also receives Best Distance Learning Student prize

In 2008, working with the University of Glamorgan, CILT launched a new on-line distance learning MSc programme, with the first students enrolling in April 2008.

Three years on, in December 2011, the first student graduated from this programme. Jenny Caddick is a Regional Operations Manager for Kuehne + Nagel, based in the midlands. Jenny was not only the first graduate from the programme but she was also the worthy recipient of the CILT-sponsored award for the Best Distance Learning Student on the MSc in International Logistics and Supply Chain Management.
