CATEGORIES

1. **R T Wynn Medallion for the Best Student Paper** (Papers on logistics or transport)
2. **Training / Development of People** (what has your organisation done to ensure that people have the skills they need to plan, develop and deliver good access and transport)
3. **Travel Demand Management** (a policy or project which helps to reduce the demand for travel, or ensures that travel is undertaken by more sustainable means and thus reduces the impact that generated traffic has on communities and local residents)
4. **Partnership** (projects which could not have been carried out without working closely with other organisations or across divisions within an organisation)
5. **Excellence in Passenger Transport** (what it says on the tin!)
6. **Transport Policy, Planning and Implementation** (the development and delivery of transport policy and planning which provides benefits in the present and in the future and will support sustainable development)
7. **Innovative Solutions** (this can include IT, technology or low carbon solutions, or new ways of working)
8. **Logistics Best Practice**
9. **Supply Chain Best Practice**
10. **Wales Transport Professional(s) of the Year**

The objective of the Awards is to celebrate best practice and highlight organisations that can make a difference. The judges are looking for a demonstration of sustainable development and new ideas that will make a lasting difference to services in Wales.

*Submissions are invited from individuals and organisations large or small, operating in Wales, in transport or logistics. The project or plan must have been started during the calendar year 2011 and if not completed should at least be able to demonstrate clear outputs or achievements. Projects started before January 2011 are not eligible. Judges will be marking on the following criteria: **E**ffectiveness and impact of output in situation described; **U**se of innovative ideas or the extension of good practice into new areas; **S**uccess in overcoming technical challenges and other difficulties; **W**ider significance and applicability to other circumstances; **C**larity of expression and comprehensibility and **Q**uality of presentation.
